





### **PCC Provides:**

- Open access In the academic year 2023-24, PCC served 9,768 students, which represents a full-time-equivalent (FTE) student enrollment of 3,933.
- Career & Technical Education (CTE) In the academic year 2023-24, 2,341 CTE certificates and degrees were awarded to PCC students. Additionally, 3,109 students were enrolled in CTE programs.
- General Education In the academic year 2023-24, 103 students graduated with an Associate of General Studies degree, while 137 graduated with either an Associate of Arts degree or an Associate of Science degree.
- Transfer to public four-year colleges and universities In the academic year 2023-24, 578 PCC students transferred to a fouryear institution.

- Concurrent Enrollment In the academic year 2023-24, PCC served 4,246 high school students, creating pathways from high school into higher education.
- Remedial Education/Basic Skills Community colleges provide remedial education for students who lack the skills to do collegelevel work. In the academic year 2023-24, PCC served 193 students in one or more remedial courses, 2% of the overall PCC headcount.
- Workforce Development In the academic year 2023-24, PCC trained 2,557 area workers through its programs (duplicated headcount). PCC's five largest partners are the Colorado Department of Corrections, Colorado Department of Transportation, the City of Pueblo, EVRAZ Pueblo, and Holcim.

## **PCC Student Information:**

• 78% of our students live in the following counties: Pueblo (48%), Fremont (12%), La Plata (10%), and Montezuma (6%). Below are some socioeconomic characteristics and demographic estimates pertaining to our service area.

## **Financial Aid:**

In the Financial Aid year 2023-24:

- PCC students received \$21.9 million in state, federal, and institutional financial aid.
- State financial aid totaled \$5.9 million while federal financial aid comprised \$15.9 million and institutional financial aid comprised \$49.6 thousand.
- 72% of PCC students qualified for federal Pell funding.
- 54% of PCC students received federal financial aid, while
  47% received state financial aid and 4% received institutional financial aid.
