



# 2025 Facts



**PCC Provides:**

- **Open access** – In the academic year 2024-25, PCC served **10,574 students**, which represents a full-time-equivalent (FTE) student enrollment of **3,797**.
- **Career & Technical Education (CTE)** – In the academic year 2024-25, **2,841 CTE certificates and degrees were awarded** to PCC students. Additionally, **3,833 students** were enrolled in CTE programs.
- **General Education** – In the academic year 2024-25, **108 students** graduated with an Associate of General Studies degree, while **127 graduated** with either an Associate of Arts degree or an Associate of Science degree.
- **Transfer to public four-year colleges and universities** – In the academic year 2023-24, **573** PCC students transferred to a four-year institution.
- **Concurrent Enrollment** – In the academic year 2024-25, PCC served **4,586 high school students**, creating pathways from high school into higher education.
- **Remedial Education/Basic Skills** – Community colleges provide remedial education for students who lack the skills to do college-level work. In the academic year 2024-25, PCC served **267 students** in one or more remedial courses, **3%** of the overall PCC headcount.
- **Workforce Development** – In the academic year 2024-25, PCC trained **1,353 area workers** through its programs (duplicated headcount). PCC’s five largest partners are the Colorado Department of Corrections, Rocky Mountain Steel Mills, Colorado Department of Youth Services, GCC Rio Grande, and CR Minerals.

**PCC Student Information:**

- **83%** of our students live in the following counties: Pueblo (**50%**), Fremont (**14%**), La Plata (**12%**), and Montezuma (**6%**). Below are some socioeconomic characteristics and demographic estimates pertaining to our service area.

- **78%** of our students attended PCC part-time

**Financial Aid:**

In the Financial Aid year 2024-25:

- PCC students received **\$24.7 million** in state, federal, and institutional financial aid.
- State financial aid totaled **\$7.9 million** while federal financial aid comprised **\$16.1 million** and institutional financial aid comprised **\$721.9 thousand**.
- **78%** of PCC students qualified for federal Pell funding.
- **48%** of PCC students received federal financial aid, while **48%** received state financial aid and **13%** received institutional financial aid.
