We offer day, evening and online classes. 73% of our students are part-time, while 22% are full-time.

In 2022-23, PCC awarded **712** associate degrees, **25** bachelor degrees, and **1,310** certificates to graduates.

PCC has the most affordable tuition in Colorado. Tuition at PCC is one-third the cost of a four-year public university.

PCC has been a Hispanic-Serving Institution for 30 years. To be designated as an HSI, at least 25% of a college's student body must be Hispanic. 33% of PCC students identify as Hispanic.

Throughout the past three decades, PCC has been the recipient of federal Title III and Title V grants to expand its ability to better serve its Hispanic student population.

PCC is the permanent site of El Movimiento: The Chicano Movement in Colorado and Pueblo. The exhibit is located on the upper level of the PCC Library on the Pueblo campus and is free to visit.

PCC champions sustainability.

Part of our power is generated from our solar panels used in a learning lab for our solar energy students.

Our Learning Center is heated and cooled by geothermal energy.

Our 60+60 transfer program offers students an opportunity to start their four-year bachelor's degree. It provides courses equivalent to the first two years of a university degree. Students can take two years at PCC, then transfer to a university to complete their four-year degree!

Hyang "Sunshine" Archibeque Business student

This Panther has a passion for fashion and a desire to help everyone feel included.

Sunshine Archibeque is a business major who plans to transfer to Colorado State University in Pueblo or Fort Collins after graduating in 2024. She wants to earn a bachelor's degree in apparel and merchandising.

"I love the way clothes can make people feel – the fashion, the colors, the campiness. I discovered (fashion) my freshman year of high school and it made me unapologetically myself," she said.

Archibeque said PCC proved to be a good place to begin her

college career due to its affordability and smaller class sizes. She is part of PCC's TRIO Student Support Services program that offers additional support for first-generation, low-income, and disabled students.

"They keep up with you and keep you accountable," she said.

People on the Pueblo campus are used to seeing Archibeque just about everywhere. She quickly got involved in campus clubs and activities such as the President's Leadership Program, Phi Beta Lambda (Future Business Leaders of America), Associated Student Government, Art Club, and the Colorado Space Grant Consortium.

Archibeque wants to use her business education to start a company that makes modest apparel. Spurred by a discussion in her accounting class, she's also interested in creating a nonprofit that assists single parents.

"My mom was a single parent for a time. I want to make a place for parents and kids – someplace you can look forward to (visiting)," she said. I'm a huge advocate for PCC, I like how it's community based. It's more engaging.

For now, however, she's focused on her final year at PCC and serving as an unofficial recruiter: She's already helped three friends enroll at the college.

In 2021, PCC and a group of partnering employers announced the creation of a Pueblo chapter of the Federation for Advanced Manufacturing Education (FAME). The program offers a combination of classroom instruction and paid on-the-job training so graduates already have two years of work experience by the time they graduate.

Daniel Ramos heard the announcement and took notice.

"I had never seen a program like this so I decided to jump at the opportunity," he said.

In May 2023, Ramos graduated with his associate degree in industrial technology maintenance and a wealth of work experience with the facility services department at PCC.



My mentors taught me in depth about things I was learning in class and gave me the extra help I needed to succeed. "(My mentors) would even take the time to explain complicated problems or explain why I was doing things, not just say, 'It needs to be done.'"

Ramos specifically praised one of his PCC mentors, Ray Marquez, for introducing him to other craftsmen who took time to answer questions and offer help.

"I could not be more grateful. Without the extra support, I would not have been so confident in my classroom studies," Ramos said. With his attention now focused on starting a career, Ramos said he'll carry many experiences with him as he joins the workforce. "I can honestly say I have learned something from each of my many teachers," he said. "From learning how to effectively communicate to the program itself, I have taken valuable life
