# At PCC, you are more than a number.

## **Skills Matter.**

PCC offers **stackable credentials** to help students quickly upskill and reskill to start a new career or advance their current career.

## **Schedules that fit your life.**

We offer **day, evening and online classes**. 73% of our students are part-time, while 22% are full-time.

## **Eyes on the prize.**

In 2022-23, PCC awarded **712** associate degrees, **25** bachelor degrees, and **1,310** certificates to graduates.

## **Where everybody knows your name.**

Our student-to-teacher ratio is **19 to 1** and the average class size is **12** students. Our small class sizes offer you **more personal interaction with faculty**, which leads to greater academic success.

## **Show me the money!**

**56%** of our students are Pell grant eligible or receiving financial aid, while the PCC Foundation has awarded **\$20 million** in scholarships since 1981.

## **Get the degree without the debt.**

PCC has the most affordable tuition in Colorado. Tuition at PCC is **one-third the cost** of a four-year public university.

## Our mascot is a Panther.

## Real-world, hands-on experience.

PCC's **Nursing and Allied Health Teaching and Learning Center** is located on the campus of St. Mary-Corwin Hospital. It offers students the opportunity to learn in a real-life medical setting with state-of-the-art learning labs and a nursing simulation lab.

## Proud to be an HSI.

PCC has been a **Hispanic-Serving Institution for 30 years**. To be designated as an HSI, at least 25% of a college's student body must be Hispanic. 33% of PCC students identify as Hispanic.

Throughout the past three decades, PCC has been the recipient of federal Title III and Title V grants to expand its ability to better serve its Hispanic student population.

PCC is the permanent site of **El Movimiento: The Chicano Movement in Colorado and Pueblo**. The exhibit is located on the upper level of the PCC Library on the Pueblo campus and is free to visit.

## PCC champions sustainability.

Part of our power is generated from our solar panels used in a learning lab for our solar energy students.

Our Learning Center is heated and cooled by geothermal energy.

Our automotive department teaches the first electric vehicle (EV) service program in the state.

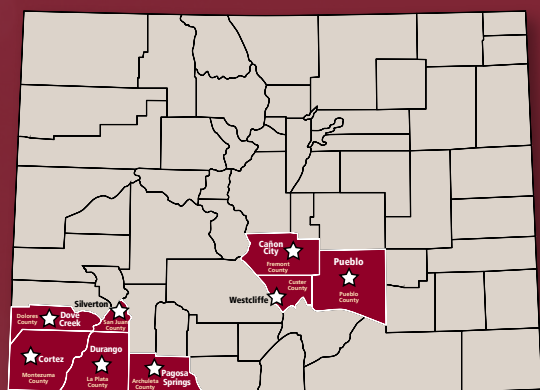
## Start here. Go anywhere.

Many PCC courses are **guaranteed to transfer** to any public four-year institution in Colorado. If your dream is to go to UCCS, CSU, CU, or CSU-Pueblo, **start at PCC for a seamless transition** with all your credits being **fully transferable!**

Our **60+60 transfer program** offers students an opportunity to start their four-year bachelor's degree. It provides **courses equivalent to the first two years of a university degree**. Students can take two years at PCC, then **transfer to a university to complete their four-year degree!**

## Our schedules fit yours!

With our **PCC Flex** program, courses are delivered **in-person on campus, online, or hybrid** (a combination of on campus and online).



## Our locations:

We have three campuses: the Orman Campus in Pueblo, the Fremont Campus in Cañon City, and PCC Southwest's Mancos Campus. PCC Southwest also has site locations in Durango and Bayfield.

## Hyang “Sunshine” Archibeque Business student



This Panther has a passion for fashion and a desire to help everyone feel included.

Sunshine Archibeque is a business major who plans to transfer to Colorado State University in Pueblo or Fort Collins after graduating in 2024. She wants to earn a bachelor’s degree in apparel and merchandising.

“I love the way clothes can make people feel – the fashion, the colors, the campiness. I discovered (fashion) my freshman year of high school and it made me unapologetically myself,” she said.

Archibeque said PCC proved to be a good place to begin her college career due to its affordability and smaller class sizes. She is part of PCC’s TRIO Student Support Services program that offers additional support for first-generation, low-income, and disabled students. “They keep up with you and keep you accountable,” she said.

People on the Pueblo campus are used to seeing Archibeque just about everywhere. She quickly got involved in campus clubs and activities such as the President’s Leadership Program, Phi Beta Lambda (Future Business Leaders of America), Associated Student Government, Art Club, and the Colorado Space Grant Consortium.

Archibeque wants to use her business education to start a company that makes modest apparel. Spurred by a discussion in her accounting class, she’s also interested in creating a nonprofit that assists single parents.

“My mom was a single parent for a time. I want to make a place for parents and kids – someplace you can look forward to (visiting),” she said.

For now, however, she’s focused on her final year at PCC and serving as an unofficial recruiter: She’s already helped three friends enroll at the college.

## Daniel Ramos

Industrial Technology Maintenance graduate



In 2021, PCC and a group of partnering employers announced the creation of a Pueblo chapter of the Federation for Advanced Manufacturing Education (FAME). The program offers a combination of classroom instruction and paid on-the-job training so graduates already have two years of work experience by the time they graduate.

Daniel Ramos heard the announcement and took notice.

“I had never seen a program like this so I decided to jump at the opportunity,” he said.

In May 2023, Ramos graduated with his associate degree in industrial technology maintenance and a wealth of work experience with the facility services department at PCC.

“(My mentors) would even take the time to explain complicated problems or explain why I was doing things, not just say, ‘It needs to be done.’”

Ramos specifically praised one of his PCC mentors, Ray Marquez, for introducing him to other craftsmen who took time to answer questions and offer help.

“I could not be more grateful. Without the extra support, I would not have been so confident in my classroom studies,” Ramos said. With his attention now focused on starting a career, Ramos said he’ll carry many experiences with him as he joins the workforce.

“I can honestly say I have learned something from each of my many teachers,” he said. “From learning how to effectively communicate to the program itself, I have taken valuable life lessons from all.”

- Log in to the **myPCC Portal** and explore the available information you can access.

### STEP 3

#### See an academic advisor

- New, re-admit, and pre-health students should see an academic advisor in the **Go!Zone**.
- Log in to **Navigate**, located on the myPCC Portal, to schedule an advising appointment.

### STEP 4

#### Register for classes & online New Student Orientation

- Log in to **Navigate**, located on the myPCC Portal, to schedule your classes.
