IV. Agency Highlight- ECE Apprenticeships

Amiee West-Red Rocks Community College

Aimee explained in 2000 there was funding in the State for Councils to use for apprenticeships. She explained for the next 12 years TRIAD worked with more than 150 apprentices to complete the program. She stated in 2022 the program went from time based (4000 hours) to a competency-based (86 guidelines) program. Aimee explained their program is a federally registered program. She stated there are two pathways to earn an early childhood certificate.

- Apprenticeship Program Requirements
 - Signed Agreements
 - Use of ApprentiScope database
 - Apprentices attend weekly meetings with the Mentor Teacher
 - Mentors and Apprentices follow up monthly with Apprenticeship staff
 - Goal setting with an individual Professional Development Plan
 - Connection with the local workforce center
 - Use of the Professional Development Information System (PDIS)
 - Wage Increases

- Roles-Employer Site Sponsor
 - Sign the sponsor agreement
 - Have a qualified journey worker (mentor)
 - Agree to release time for classes/training
 - Agree to pay increases upon apprenticeship completing goals
 - Complete the paperwork in a timely manner
 - o Allowing council/apprenticeship sponsor access as needed to do an evaluation of
 - apprentice and journey worker
- Roles Mentor
 - Selected by Employer Sponsor
 - Early Childhood Teacher or director qualified
 - Mentor teachers are required to have a credential level higher than the person they are mentoring
 - 3 years or more in an early childhood program
 - Complete Mentor Teacher Training
- Roles Apprentice
 - 16 years of age or older
 - Employed or willing to be employed full time at an early childhood program
 - Shows a commitment to the quality of care they provide
 - Willing to make a 2-year commitment
 - Willing and able to meet all applicable licensing and employer requirements

Amiee explains the benefits for the apprentices. She provided the link to apply.

C. Children First NEW Location

Angie Shehorn (Children First)

Angie stated Children First has moved to the new office space at 1000 Minnequa Avenue at St. Mary Corwin. She encouraged the council to stop by and see the new space. She mentioned excitement for opportunities at SMC. She invited all to the ribbon cutting on January 26 at 2pm and tour the building. Angie explained PECC Meetings will now be at the new location-1000 Minnequa at the East tower of SMC on the 1st floor in the IN Bank Conference Room.

D. SECC

Matt Guy-Community Mobilizer (Common Thread Group) http://www.commonthread.group/

Matt stated they are still looking for parents. He explained the participants will receive a stipend and will meet once a month for 15 minutes (over Zoom), the last part of February. He explained the participants will be paid, attend the Rocky Mountain Childhood Conference, March 10-11 and the Shared Risk Factors Conference May 31st to June 2nd in Keystone. He sated it provides educational and leadership opportunities.

E. Circle

Matt stated there is a training for teachers, March 31, 8:30 am to 3:30 pm, Pre-k to 2nd Grade, in the Hoag Theater at PCC. He stated there will be a speaker from the *aha!* Group. Registration flyer is going out and lunch will be provided sponsored by Early Milestones. Matt shared the results of the survey regarding early childhood suspensions and expulsions. He stated the work is funded by a Colorado Department of Environment called Communities that Care. Angie will share the slides.

- Three Main Components
 - Gathering basic early childhood program information (number of children enrolled, number of staff, demographics, full time vs part time, zip code)
 - Collecting data on the number of children suspended or expelled from early childhood programs over the past 12 months
 - Inquiring about the use of support programs (mental health consultation, Pyramid model, other resources) to help avoid suspensions and expulsions
- Conclusions
 - There is a need for a common language regarding early childhood suspensions and expulsions in the Pueblo County early childhood community
 - Early childhood providers need to have suspension and expulsion policies that are consistently followed and match state regulations and law
 - Informal suspensions and expulsions do occur in early childhood programs in Pueblo County
 - There is a need to link supports to programs who perform informal suspensions and expulsions
 - Informal suspensions and expulsions are strictly prohibited by state law for programs receiving state funds (including CCCAP)
 - Available interventions are not widely known and used by Pueblo County early childhood providers
 - More training is desired on child development, dealing with challenging and concerning behaviors, and creating effective relationships (child/teacher/parent)

Angie informed the council there will be an online training starting February. She mentioned if participants live within Pueblo County the fees will be will be covered by scholarships. She stated Rebecca Bellavia will be available to help with the licensing process. Angie asked that interested parties reach out to Children First.

Angie stated April 22, 2023 there will be a Southern Colorado Business Conference for Early Childhood. She stated a Save the Date flyer has gone out and an agenda will go out with more information.
