III. Agency Highlight-Caring for Colorado/Packard

Gina Lopez-Ferguson-Caring for Colorado

Gina introduced herself as Director of Play Based Philanthropy for the Caring for Colorado Foundation housed in Denver and Caryn Apodaca is their Philanthropy Coordinator. She stated they are Pueblo natives and work on local grant making efforts. Gina mentioned their advisory board is in the process of strategic planning for the Packard Fund for Pueblo and want to engage the councils voice regarding early childhood to target strategies and focus areas. Gina proceeded to give a brief history about David Packard and the Packard Foundation. She mentioned in 2018 the Packard Foundation wanted to ensure Packard's legacy in Pueblo and therefore awarded an endowment of \$20 million dollars stipulating organizations in only Pueblo County could apply and grant making decisions will be made locally by a community advisory board. She mentioned there is one open board position open for the spring. Gina stated there are two grant cycles. She explained the are children, youth, and families and community impact circle grants. A discussion ensued.

IV. New Business:

A. UPK Updates

Paula Arellano-Children First

Paula stated the following updates.

390 applications (children are not yet matched) – Angie is working through these
applications to determine why they are not matched and to get the child
matched with a program

Reasons:

- family moved away from community
- family decided to not send child
- duplicate application
- only one program selected and no available seats
- Currently 366 open seats available in Pueblo throughout county
- 331 children enrolled 10hrs week (\$504.21 per child)
- 607 children enrolled 15hrs week (\$630.06 per child)
- 25 children enrolled 30hrs week (\$1087.36 per child)
- In October alone UPK has brought into the community just over \$575,000
- 103 children eligible for 30hrs week but not currently enrolled in a 30hr week program (Angie is contacting both families and programs to determine next steps -A. does the program have the ability to offer 30hrs week (if yes, move child to 30hr position, if no, B. does family want to move to another provider who offers 30hr program or stay where they are and forfeit 30hr eligibility) *30hr eligibility criteria: MUST HAVE income below 270% federal poverty level AND 1 other criterion:
 - Individualized Education Program (IEP)
 - Homelessness
 - Dual language learner
 - Foster/Kinship care

Families can still apply for UPK for this school year

Applications for next school year are not available until Spring 2024.
