- I. Introduction: Meeting called to order by Angie at 11:00 am.

III. Agency Highlight-Healthy Halloween Data/CSU-P Nursing Students

CSU-P Senior Nursing Students

Audrie explained global/public health nursing.

- Improving health outcomes
- Providing resources
- Incorporating nursing process
- Implement health studies for equitable health care
- Enhance well-being of many populations worldwide
- Surveillance of possible/localized outbreaks

She explained Healthy Halloween is a yearly event promoting health and wellness, available resources and support for children ages zero through five years old and children with special needs. She stated it creates an ability for children to play and interact and their parents have the opportunity to receive support. She reported the pediatric rotation nursing students attended to provide information as well. Other students addressed the research that supports the benefits of Healthy Halloween through the following articles-

- 1. <u>The Influence of a Development Disability on the Child's Weight-related Behaviors: A</u>
 Parent's Perspective
- 2. <u>Association between Unhealthful Eating Patterns and Unfavorable Overall School Performance in Children</u>
- 3. <u>A Review of the Association of Blue Food Coloring with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder Symptoms in Children.</u>
- 4. Quality of Life and Family Impact in Down Syndrome, Autism Spectrum Disorder, and Co-Occurring Down Syndrome and Autism Spectrum Disorder

Another nursing student explained the process they use to determine the population (children 0-5yrs Special Needs and families living in poverty). They then explained how they picked exhibitors based on resources and education (Colorado Bluesky, Children First, Catholic Charities of Southern Colorado, CASA, Team Select Health Care, EPIC, WIC, CDPHE, Health Solutions, Head Start, Early Learning Ventures, Academy Kids Dental, Vision & Orthopedics, CSU-Pueblo Nursing Students.). Ana explained the planning portion of the event in regards to marketing, vendor contact and budget/décor. The students explained their advertisement-flyers and punch cards for the raffle they hosted. A student reported on the implementation process and lastly the evaluation. A discussion ensued.

IV. New Business:

A. Support the Early Childhood Community (SECC)-Matt

Matt Guy-Common Thread

Matt stated the parent coalition met a grant goal regarding a non-suspension and expulsion policy in District 60 and District 70. He stated they will now work on other programs with suspension/expulsion policies throughout the county. Angie reported due to the great work performed around the suspension and expulsion process, funding has been extended an additional year. She stated District 70 has taken to heart the process and are working on recording supporting documents in case that may lead to a suspension or expulsion. Matt stated they have developed a great relationship with the districts to support the children. He stated there is a great interaction with community supports such as Health Solutions and Children First. He reported the parent coalition was a great influence on the way the districts function. Angie stated that Pueblo is the only community in the state awarded CTC-A and CTC-B funds (Communities that Care). Matt acknowledged parents in the coalition. Teresa just reminded the parents to send in their documentation for their gift cards. Matt requested participants fill out the survey Angie has sent out to get a gift card for your response (name must be included). A discussion ensued.

B. UPK Updates

Angie Shehorn-Children First

Angie reiterated the monthly payments will be going into the programs monthly through May and then there will not be any payments during the summer. She mentioned there will be open applications in early 2024, possibly February. She reported programs can enroll in January and families maybe in February. Angie stated there will be many changes that will help the continuity of care next year. She emphasized three-year old's will likely be managed by the school districts going forward due to the burdens of cutoff dates and district differences. Angie reported the last UPK match was November 6, and the LCO inputted manually after that date to secure a seat for the children. She reported a fair amount of money is coming in to UPK programs and with the passing of Proposition II there will be much more funds available going forward. A discussion ensued. Angie stated the Governor has a WIG (Wildly Important Goal) of 94% retention of the UPK providers will remain and the governors proposed budget is requesting a two percent increase in UPK and CCCAP funding.

C. New Staff and Open Position

Angie Shehorn-Children First

Angie stated there is an open position for an early childhood coach. She mentioned a new staff member for the UPK Family Specialist was hired and will start December 1, 2023.

D. Council Chair

Angie Shehorn-Children First

Angie stated PECC needs a chair person. She explained the job duties of the council chair. She questioned the council members if we need a chair person and it was voted a chair person is not needed.

Angie asked if anyone had questions regarding the meeting dates. She mentioned if one cannot attend, minutes are always available after the meeting. She stated the Zoom link will remain the same.
