A. Pueblo Community Perspective-Early Childhood in Pueblo

Angie Shehorn (Children First)

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B. UPK Updater

Angie Shehorn (Children First)

Angie stated emails went out to parents to accept offers. She mentioned the District cutoff is October 1st and the children 5 years old by this date will not be eligible for UPK. Angie explained children turning 4 years old by October 1st are eligible for UPK enrollment. She explained there is far more children with IEP's than capacity. She stated by the middle of April parents will have a two-week timeframe to accept matches and then there will be a second matching. She mentioned some programs have dropped out already and there is shortage of slots for projected about of children needing preschool. She was excited to share 86% of four-year old children were matched with their first choice. Angie proceeded to explain there is \$22 million extra dollars collected from Prop EE (tobacco and nicotine tax) and the state will have to go back to the voters on the ballot in November, due to the Tabor Act, to see if the money can be kept for the UPK program. A discussion ensued.

C. SECC

Matt Guy-Community Mobilizer (Common Thread Group) http://www.commonthread.group/

Matt stated the first parent coalition meeting was held Thursday during the day and the evening virtually for introductions. He informed the council the coalition is fully staffed with two men and eight women including parents and grandparents. He stated the summer meeting will be in person.

Matt Guy-Community Mobilizer (Common Thread Group) Matt stated events will be discussed further into the meeting-April events.

E. New suspension and expulsion legislation

Matt Guy-Community Mobilizer (Common Thread Group) Matt informed the council there is a new suspension and expulsion piece of legislation wandering through. He explained that in 2019 legislation was passed eliminating expulsion and suspending of children by providers that accept state funding. He stated the new legislation will add due process for parents and the children. Matt explained it will add interaction between primarily school districts, the parents, children and outside agencies. He stated there will be training at the Department of Education Facility between parents, school districts and outside entities. Matt stated it has passed the House and is waiting for the Senate approval. He emphasized Pueblo's perspective is needed. He stated the committee hearings are online.

F. RMECC-recap and thoughts

Brenda mentioned she took pictures to share. Kristie Dorwart stated she was very pleased with the leadership and social/emotional sessions at the conference. She loved the behavioral health sessions. Matt mentioned conversations with Pueblo group discussing what is done already. A discussion ensued. Dwanette thought the conference was organized, resourceful, and appreciated the networking. She agreed they are on track with professional development at their program. She appreciated the support given to parents in attendance. Matt recommended those with positive thoughts should speak at next years conference to highlight Pueblo. There was a concern that Pueblo was not represented at the awards ceremony. Berlinda mentioned Otero had a huge presence at the conference and the flexibility to attend sessions.
