Application:

- Applications are due by **April 1st (Given in the RTE 101 Introduction to Radiography course)**. **If the student has taken or is taking the Intro course at PPCC or any other CCCS college, he/she must contact program faculty at PCC to obtain an application.**
- Must have at least “C” (2.0) GPA and in course work
- **All** applicants must take a test on prerequisite class knowledge about information learned in the prerequisite classes. Points will be awarded for test scores based on the following table:
 - **Below 70% - 0 points**
 - **70 – 80% - 1 point**
 - **81 – 90% - 2 points**
 - **91 – 100% - 6 points**

General Program Information:

- The Radiology program is 5 semesters long. All the prerequisites to include the RTE 1001 course must be completed or in progress during the spring semester of the year the student plans to apply. We evaluate applications in April. We score each applicant in 5 different areas for the first part of the selection process (see score sheet). Then the

second part of the selection process is the interview. Each applicant qualifying for an interview will be interviewed by a panel. We add the initial score to the interview score and the top 30-40 scores are accepted into the program for the class starting in the fall. The program is like having a full-time job. The first 2 semester there are clinics on Tuesdays and Thursdays (day, evening, and overnight shifts and possibly weekends) and class on Mondays and Wednesdays all day. During the 3rd semester (summer), there are clinics Monday-Sunday (40 hrs/week) for 8 weeks. The 4th and 5th semesters there are clinics Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays (day, evening, overnight, and weekend shifts) and class on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

After graduation and successful completion of the ARRT registry, the salary for a registered Radiologic Technologist ranges from \$41,184.00 to \$66,152.00.
