

Building Skills for the Future

PCC's workforce training program will have in-class and experiential learning, during which students will complete remodels and new construction of blighted properties.

Through a partnership with the Colorado attorney general, this 16-week program allows students to spend time in class and labs. Students will receive a \$15 an hour stipend for their afternoon work on the job site.

Students will receive basic hand tools and a tool belt. Class textbooks are also provided at no cost. Students will have access to equipment normally found on a job site, including power tools, ladders, and safety equipment.

Introduction to Craft Skills includes:

- Construction site safety orientation
- · Intro to construction math
- Intro to hand tools
- Intro to power tools
- Intro to construction drawings
- Intro to basic rigging
- · Basic communication skills
- Basic employment skills
- · Intro to material handling

Carpentry Level 1 includes:

- Orientation to the trade
- · Building materials, fasteners and adhesives
- Hand and power tools
- · Intro to construction drawing, specifications & layouts
- Floor systems
- · Wall systems
- Ceiling joist and roofing framing
- Intro to building envelope systems
- · Basic stair layouts
